

Language examinations





Language examination

Arabic, Chinese, English, French, Russian, Spanish

- Editors, Interpreters, Proofreaders, Translators, Verbatim
- Based on the needs of the United Nations
- All language staff must pass the applicable examination
- Language staff hired from the roster at the entry level (P-2) (average number of candidates placed on the roster in last 10 years: 100)
- Eligibility and requirements
 - Hold at least a first-level university degree (For the Interpreters: First University degree plus 200 days of experience in language field or degree in interpretation)
 - Interpret or translate from two official languages into main language
 - No more than 55 years old as of 31 December of exam year

UNDP MID-LEVEL PROFESSIONAL PROGRAMME



What are the requirements?

- ✓ Master's degree in a relevant field
- ✓ 5 years relevant work experience, preferably field-based
- ✓ English and another official UN language
- \checkmark 33 37 years of age





Young Professional Programme (YPP) Recruitment Examination

- Entry level (P-2): filled through competitive examinations
- Held annually based on a country's representation among staff
- YPP applicants must be:
 - National of participating Member State
 - No more than 32 years old as of 31 December of exam year
 - Hold at least a first-level university degree relevant to an occupational group offered
 - Proficient in either English or French

YPP 2014

- Application period: Staggered
 - - May-June
 - -June-July
 - Careers.un.org
- Date of exam worldwide: 4 December 2014
- Exam location: you can take exam in participating country so long as there are at least 15 people
- Duration of exam: 4.5 hours

- Unpaid and full-time
- Requirements:
 - University student or within one year after graduation
 - Duration: minimum 2 months, up to 6 months
- Apply to the duty station of choice
- No. of interns world-wide: over 4400 per biennium

About UNV


- Administered by UNDP

- UN General Assembly resolutions have expanded UNV's mandate:
 - 1. MOBILIZE volunteers (directly & indirectly) for peace & development,

 - 3. **INTEGRATE** volunteerism into development plans of UN partners, governments, civil society & private sector.



UN Volunteers in 2013

6,351 UN Volunteers from 152 countries carried out

6,459 UNV assignments in 129 countries



Of these UN Volunteers:

81% from developing countries


26% volunteered within their own countries

- **38** years average age
- **5-10** years average working experience
 - 152 nationalities
- **100+** professional categories:
 - Programme Officers
 - Medical Doctors
 - Human Rights Officers
 - Vehicle Mechanics





financial support to international UN Volunteers

- ✓ Return air tickets (when taking up the assignment and at the end of it);
- ✓ Shipment covering any excess luggage;
- Lump sum payment to cover initial expenses to help settle in the country of assignment;
- ✓ Monthly volunteer living allowance;
- ✓ Annual leave (2.5 days per month of service);
- ✓ Insurance life/health and permanent disability.
- ✓ Resettlement allowance




basic requirements

- ✓ At least 25 years old
- ✓ University degree or higher technical diplomas
- Minimum two years of relevant working experience
- ✓ Good working knowledge in at least one of the UN working languages
- ✓ Ability to work in a multi-cultural environment
- ✓ Ability to adjust in difficult living conditions
- ✓ Strong interpersonal and organizational skills
- ✓ Prior volunteer experience is an asset
- ✓ Work experience in a developing country is an asset.

UNV Youth Volunteers Programme

What does it aim at?

- Advocate for youth volunteerism and ensure that youth voices are included in the development discourse.
- Work with national, regional and global partners to create enabling environments for youth volunteering.
- Create more opportunities for young people to volunteer through a UN Youth Volunteering modality.





The UN Youth Volunteering modality

- For young volunteers from 18 to 29 years of age
- Volunteers work for a UN project or programme
- Volunteer assignments are between 6-24 months long
- Volunteers get hands-on experience in international peace and development
- Training, support and mentoring is given
