Young professionals programme

The United Nations is looking for highly qualified candidates who are ready to launch a professional career as an international civil servant. The young professionals programme (YPP) is a recruitment initiative that brings new talent to the United Nations through an annual entrance examination. For young, high-calibre professionals across the globe, the examination is a platform for launching a career at the United Nations. This programme builds upon the national competitive recruitment examination (NCRE) which was held for the last time in 2010.

Are you eligible to participate in the young professionals programme examination?

Do you hold at least a first-level university degree?

Are you 32 or younger by the end of this year?

Do you speak either English and/or French fluently?

Are you a national of a participating country?

Admission



Application

- **Application period:** 14 June – 27 August 2014 (11:59 PM EST) through the United Nations Careers Portal <http://careers.un.org> – in a staggered way



- » **14 June – 13 August:** Information Systems and Technology; and Political Affairs
- » **21 June – 20 August:** Economic Affairs; and Radio Producer (Arabic /Chinese/Kiswahili/Russian/Spanish);
- » **28 June – 27 August:** Human Rights; and Photography.



Application

- **Important:** Incomplete, incorrect (field of study!) and/or late applications will **NOT** be considered.
- **Acknowledgement:** Applicants will receive by e-mail an acknowledge receipt of their application.)
- **Application number:** Once convoked to the written exam, candidates will receive an application number



Admission

First Screening- Eligibility

- **Nationality:** Must hold the nationality of a participating Member State at the time of application
- **Age:** 32 years or younger (Date of birth: On or after 1 January 1982)
- **Education:** First-level university degree **acceptable** for each job family
- **Language:** Fluency in English or French
- **Experience:** No experience *required*



Admission

Second Screening

- If more than 40 qualified applicants from the same participating Member State in the same job family, a second round of screening will be conducted.
- Criteria for the second screening:
 - **Degree:** Additional and/or higher-level degrees acceptable for the job family
 - **Experience:** Length of work experience acceptable for the job family
 - **Language:** Fluency in additional official languages of the United Nations



Convokees

- All candidates will receive notification regarding their admission to the written examination.
- Applicants may check the listing of application numbers on the United Nations Careers Portal <http://careers.un.org>.
- Members States will be informed on the numbers of convokees by examination centre.

The Examination



Examination Centres

- An examination centre in the capital of a participating Member State if **at least 15** convoked examinees for that location
- Preference for an examination centre by examinees during the submission of application
- Responsibility of Member States:
 - ✓ Proctors
 - ✓ Suitable examination centre
 - ✓ Receipt and secure storage of the examination material



Examination Administration

- A United Nations examination administrator:
Designated to each examination centre.
- Member State Focal Point in the capital:
Liaise with the UN examination administrator
in preparation of the written examination.



The Examination

Written Part



- **Specialized Paper:** Multiple choice questions, essays and short questions in the substantive area, to be answered in any of the UN official languages. Each part of this paper will be eliminatory.
- **General Paper: Summary,** to be written in either English or French.



The Examination

Written Part (continued)

- The overall time for the written examination:
4.5 hours
- Examinees are fully responsible for any expenses related to their travel to the examination centre.



- Competency-based interview and possibly an oral presentation.

Useful tips for your interview:

At your interview

The United Nations' greatest asset is the quality of its staff. To ensure that UN team we use a competency based interview process. Competency "behavioral interviews" or "criterion based interviews." Such interviews past behavior and experience is the best indicator of future performance. It tells a story about you: your talents, skills, abilities, knowledge and variety of situations.

Competency interviewing questions can look like this:

- Tell us about a situation when you went above and beyond you
- Give an example of a time when you used your problem solving
- Tell us about a time where you had a number of demands being time? How did you handle it?

- UN Secretariat will use an online video conferencing tool, e.g. Skype, to reduce the travel cost.

Placement



List of Successful Candidates



- Success candidates will be eligible for consideration for positions at the P-1 or P-2 level in any Secretariat duty station or peacekeeping operation.
- Placement exercise will be conducted centrally 4 times a year.
- The list has a lifespan of two years from the beginning of the first quarterly placement taking place following the conclusion of the examination cycle.
- Candidates refusing to participate in the placement exercise will be removed from the list.



Available posts for Placement

The posts available for placement of successful 2014 YPP candidates include:

- Regular budget posts at the P-1 and P-2 levels
- 15 % of extra-budgetary posts not financed through peacekeeping account at the P-1 and P-2 levels



Successful Candidates Assignment, Orientation & Development

- **Initial assignment:** Two years
- **Second assignment:** In a different duty station (P-1=>P-2, P-2=>P-2)
- **Two-week orientation programme** prior to the beginning of their first assignment
