

Conditions for entry of persons to the territory of the Czech Republic in accordance with the Ministry of Health Protective Measure
- based on the nationality of the person (category of persons) and at the same time based on the country from which the person enters

1. **Entry from a green country – the countries with the low risk of COVID-19 incidence list:** same conditions as prior to the COVID-19 pandemic
2. **Entry from an orange country – the countries with the low risk of COVID-19 incidence list marked with *:** conditions in relation to the COVID-19 pandemic prior to the entry to workplace or an educational institution
3. **Entry from a red country (after stay longer than 12 hours) – not included in the countries with the low risk of COVID-19 list:** conditions in relation to the COVID-19 pandemic listed below

STATE OF EMERGENCY: at the current moment valid from 05. 10. 2020 until 20. 11. 2020 and other measures and restrictions are applicable.

A. Citizen of the Czech Republic

- they may enter the Czech territory at any time

****Citizens of the Czech Republic, EU and citizen of the third countries** with permitted long-term or permanent residence in the European Union, are allowed to meet the requirement of submitting themselves, at their own expense, to an RT-PCR test for the presence of SARS CoV-2, by presenting a negative result of RT-PCR test for the presence of SARS CoV-2, which has been performed in the territory of the EU member state and which is not older than 72 hours; the test result is submitted immediately on entry into the territory of the Czech Republic to a regional Public Health Office.
