The exhibition **"WHO AM I?"** is the result of an interesting and innovative project when the children, teachers and some guests all worked together for several months. Throughout the project, the participants have been searching for the answer to the question that gave the exhibition its title: Who am I? The exhibited works will evoke different emotions in every participant but we are pretty sure that no one will leave emotionless.

The project **"WHO AM I?"** was created in collaboration with the REAL School in Budapest. It aims to find out what makes a person unique and self-identical. The drawings were made by children who were forced to leave their homes a year ago because of the war and are now living in Budapest and studying in the educational spaces run by the EGYSÉG Ukrainian Association. The idea of the project was invented by the refugee teachers who participated in project-based learning training at the REAL School – this is when they noticed that they were often called "refugees" and that this made them uncomfortable, so they started to ask themselves: what are the things that really characterise a person, what makes me self-identified, what makes me ME? Because everyone can find themselves in another country and feel like a stranger. What do I like? What are my hobbies, what's my favourite sport, my favourite book, or maybe something else? The exhibition aims to raise the public awareness about what it is like to be a refugee. And to make you think: what is left after you have lost everything?
