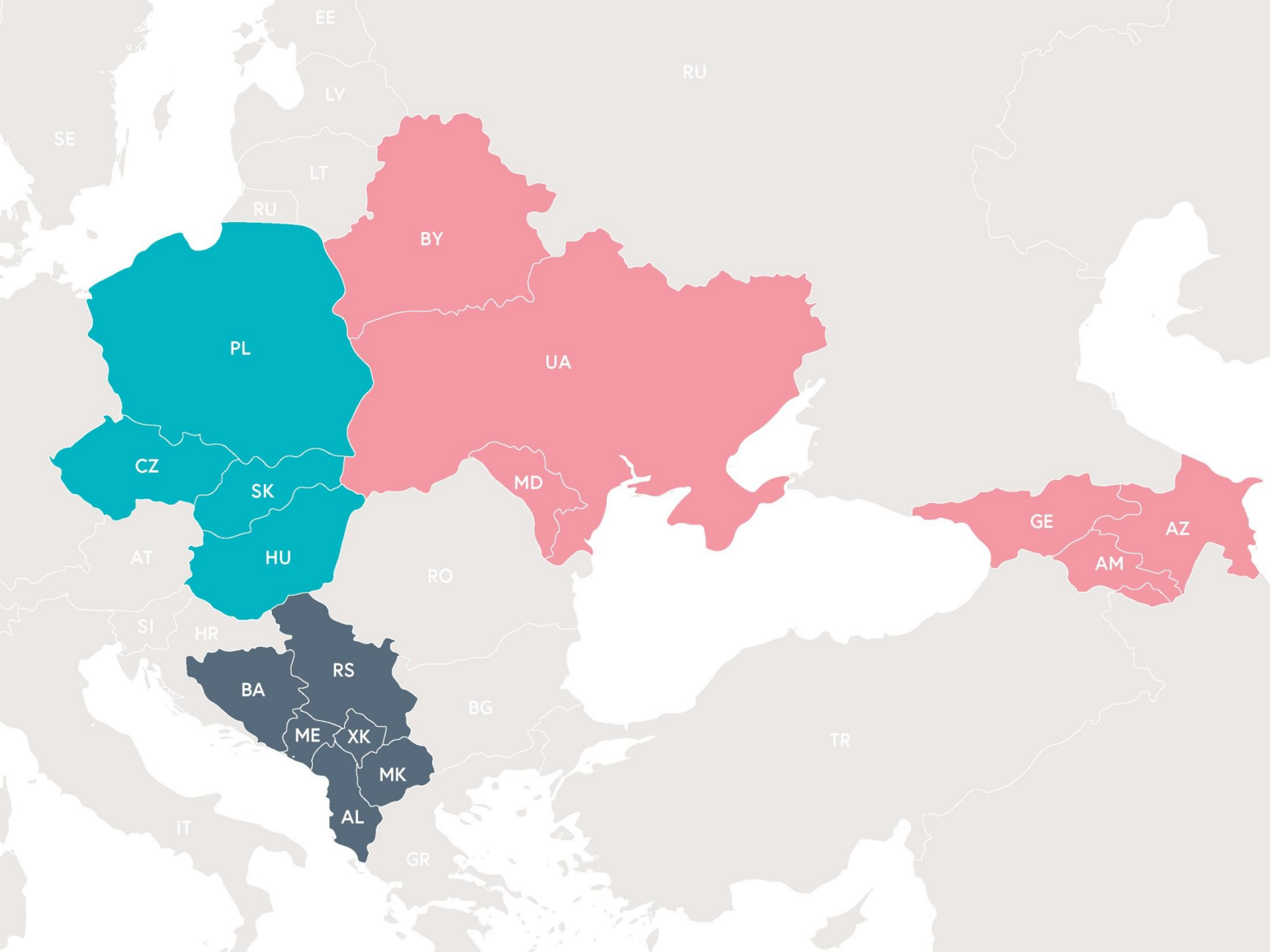

# “Advancing Ideas for Sustainable Regional Cooperation in Central Europe”

- Visegrad Group = 1991; Visegrad Fund = 2000
- Established to develop and foster ties among citizens and institutions in the V4 region (bottom-up)
- Basic objectives: development of civil society and support of internal cohesion of the region
- Key principle: governmental funds → non-governmental recipients
- Principal beneficiaries: civil society organizations, public institutions, municipalities, local/regional governments, private citizens
- Search for impactful ideas with value added for the region
- Focus—internal (V4) and external (primarily EaP and WB6 regions)



# The fund in a nutshell

- V4's only (solid) organization to date
- Status of international organization with the seat in Bratislava
- Equal rights & equal duties of V4 member states:
  - rotating presidency in the fund/the group (January–December/July–June)
  - rotating management (3-year missions of Exec. Dir./Deputy Exec. Dir.)
  - consensus in decision-making (coordination by V4 MFAs)
- Budget = annual contributions (€2.5 million p.a./country)
- Co-financing external chapters since 2012 (Canada, Germany, the Netherlands, Sweden, South Korea, Switzerland, U.S.A.)
- Staff of ±14 staff members + 2 executives (+ interns)

# Visegrad Grants/Visegrad+ Grants/Strategic Grants

- ideas with V4 added value
- active participation of project partners from at least 3 V4 countries
- grant can cover up to 100% of project costs
- paid in tranches  
(up to 80% of project costs paid in advance; the rest after Final Report)
- up to 15% overhead costs
- costs documented by copies of invoices/contracts, or by audit report  
(grants with budgets of €10,001 or higher)
- one project per applicant  
(project partnerships not limited)
- applying online: February 1, June 1, October 1

# Visegrad/Visegrad+ Grants Project Cycle

## Timeline

Deadlines: 1 Feb / 1 Jun / 1 Oct



- max. project duration = **18 months** (Strategic Grants = 18–36 months)
- **2 rounds** of group evaluations →
  - ExecDir **recommends** projects to the MFAs →
  - Council of Ambassadors gives **final approval** within 60 workdays
- individual **consultations** before deadline/individual **feedback** to rejected applicants



## V4 Gen Mini Grants

- youth exchanges between groups of 12–30 Y.O. (bilateral, trilateral...)
- active participation of project partners from at least 2 V4 countries
- grant can cover up to 100% of project costs
- paid in tranches  
(up to 80% of project costs paid in advance; the rest after Final Report)
- budget constructed on the basis of people-days (e.g., # of students and accompanying persons \* days \* €50–60)
- no documentation of costs or auditing  
(table with cost overview and attendance sheets)
- one project per applicant  
(project partnerships not limited)
- applying online: March 15, July 15, November 15

# V4 Gen Mini-Grants Project Cycle

## Timeline

Deadline: 15 Mar / 15 Jul / 15 Nov



- max. project duration = **6 months**
- two-stage application: **drafts first** (by Mar 1, July 1 and Nov. 1), then full application form (= individual consultations)
- suitable for “simple” cross-visits of groups of young people (12–30) organized by relevant organizations (schools, youth clubs, sports club, NGOs, etc.)

# Visegrad Scholarship Program

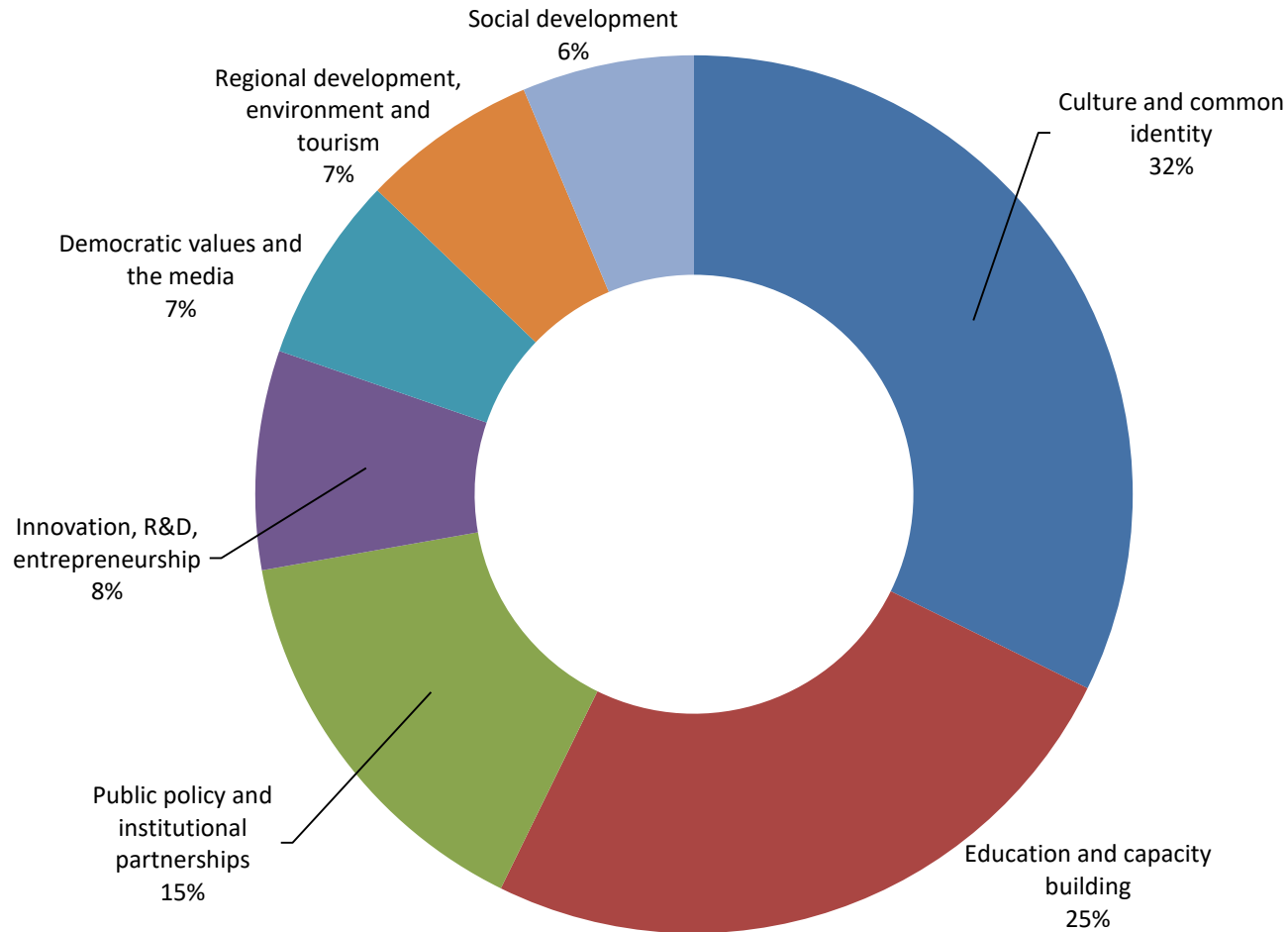
- reciprocal individual mobility:
  - within the V4 region (Intra-Visegrad)
  - reciprocal between the V4 region and the EaP countries and the Western Balkans (Out-going/In-coming)
- BA, MA, PhD, postdoc levels (2 concluded semesters = minimum)
- support of both scholar and host HEI (€2,500 + €1,500/sem.)
- no limit as to age, student status and host institution  
(all accredited public or private HEIs, incl. science academies)
- applying online only by March 15

# Visegrad Artist Residency Programs

- individual and group mobility w/in the V4 region
- Visual & Sound Arts
- Performing Arts (ind. + group residencies)
- Literary Residencies (w/ Villa Decius, Cracow)
- Residencies in New York  
(w/ Arts in General, Brooklyn, NY)
- Fashion Residency Program in Milan
- applying online only (deadlines individual)

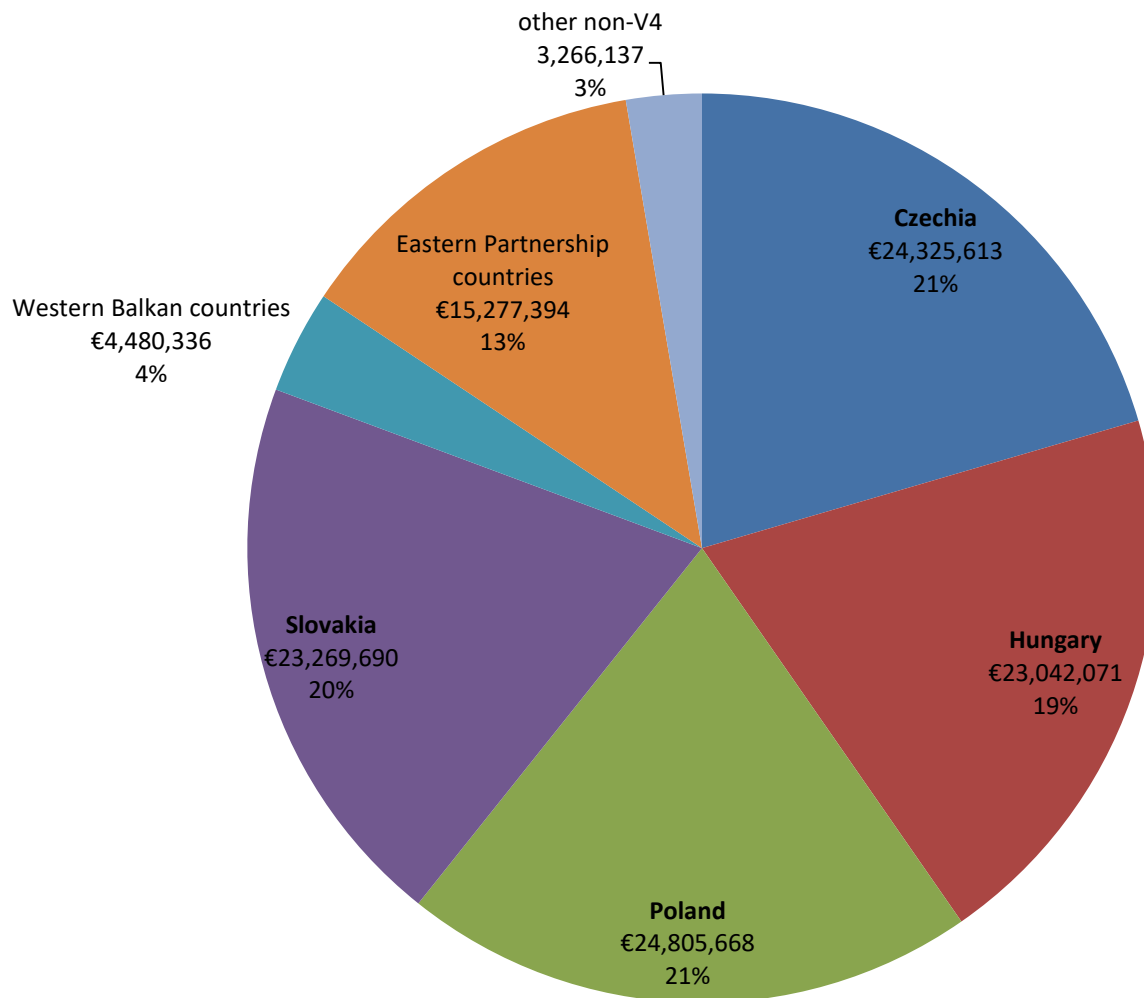


# Visegrad Grants—main focus areas



100% = 6,500+ grant projects approved in 2000–2022

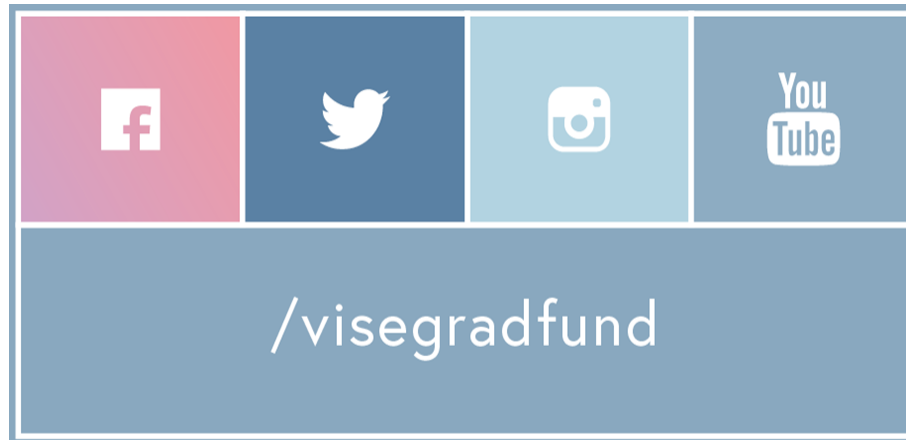
# Support by country/region

## Main results in figures:

<b><u>≈ 120 million</u></b>	total approved sum (€)
<b>&gt; <u>6,500</u></b>	total number of approved grant projects
<b>≈ <u>3,500</u></b>	total number of supported individual scholars
<b>➤ <u>750</u></b>	number of cities with approved grants
<b>&gt; <u>500</u></b>	total number of approved artist residencies
<b>≈ <u>250</u></b>	number of universities hosting supported scholars
<b><u>39</u></b>	number of countries with supported projects
<b><u>11</u></b>	number of currently operated programs
<b>≈ <u>25%</u></b>	average application “success rate”
