authors. Ensemble Moscheles also wants to make the unique compositions of current Israel composers available to the European listener.

Angelika Pavlech, mezzosoprano, Slovakia

Angelika Pavlech was born in Bánovce, Slovakia. She started her singing lessons at Desider Kardos Conservatory of Music in Topol'čany. During her time at Krakow Academy of Music she received a Principal's award for successfully representing College abroad. After the return to Slovakia she pursued her solo career and became a member of Ensemble Moscheles.





Tomáš Tuláček, violin, Czech Republic

Tomáš Tuláček was born in Prague. He started performing at the age of eight and as a member of a piano trio he appeared several times on Czech TV. After study at the Prague Conservatory and Prague Music Academy he started in 1981 his postgraduate studies in London, where he stayed during the next 25 years. He performed as soloist and then as concertmaster in the New chamber orchestra of Oxford. These days he lives in Slovakia and works as a pedagogue and soloist.

Uri Brener, piano, Israel

Uri Brener was born 1974 in Moscow and has been playing the piano since the age of four. His first compositional attempts go back to the age of seven, his first acclaimed opuses appeared at the age of 12. After studying and performing in Russia, Germany and Holland, he moved to Israel, where he got his PhD at the University of Bar-Ilan. He has written dozens of compositions in a wide variety of styles and genres. Uri has won a series of prestigious awards and scholarships.
