

**David E. Baker** is Vice President for External Affairs of the Illinois Institute of Technology since March 1995. He is responsible for the University's governmental relations, marketing and communications, and trustee relations. Since 2001 he has worked to create the University Technology Park at IIT of which he served as founding Executive Director from 2006 to 2016. He managed all university strategic plans from 1993 through 2009. He helped to create the Perspectives Charter Schools/IIT Math & Science Academy. Prior to

joining the University, Mr. Baker served as President of The Illinois Coalition, whose mission is to strengthen the Illinois economy through science and technology. From 1980 to 1989, Mr. Baker served as the Executive Vice President of the Illinois State Chamber of Commerce, the state's largest business advocacy organization. Mr. Baker served as the 2012-2013 President of the Association of University Research Parks, and is also on the boards of Perspectives Charter Schools and Lincoln Park Village. He served as Chair of the Heidelberg Club International of Chicago from 2008 to 2015.

lan Foster is a Professor of Computer Science at the University of Chicago and a Senior Scientist and Distinguished Fellow at Argonne National Laboratory. Originally from New Zealand, he has lived in Chicago for longer than he likes to admit. Ian has a long record of research contributions in high-performance computing, distributed systems, and data-driven discovery. He has also led US and international projects that have produced widely used software systems and scientific computing

infrastructures. He has published hundreds of scientific papers and six books on these and other topics. Ian is an elected fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science, the Association for Computing Machinery, and the British Computer Society. His awards include the British Computer Society's Lovelace Medal and the IEEE Tsutomu Kanai award.



**Steph Avalos-Bock**, as Senior Program Manager, leads the Chicago Innovation Exchage's quickly growing mentorship program and directs its educational programming and speaker series, in addition to working with and mentoring companies in the CIE's Incubator. She works with 50 mentors that serve over 2,100 CIE members and actively recruits and onboards new mentors. Since opening in October 2014, the CIE has hosted over 700 events and workshops for thousands of attendees and visitors. Prior to the CIE, Steph was a consultant to Fortune 500

**Bořek Lizec** is a Czech career diplomat, currently serving as the Consul General in Chicago. He joined the foreign service in 1999. Prior to this position he was the Deputy Director of the Public Diplomacy Department of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. He also served as the Spokesman and General Assemply Coordinator at the Permanent Mission to the United Nations in New York during the Czech Presidency of the European Union. In 2005 he was assigned the tast

of opening the Consulate General in Chicago and later stayed in the city as Deputy Consul General till 2008. Mr. Lizec specialized during his graduate studies in international trade (in the Czech Republic) and later also political science (Austria and United States). His main academic interest lies in the transatlantic relationship and implications of European integration for its future development. This was reflected also in his doctoral thesis titled "Transatlantic Team versus Transatlantic Partnership - European and Transatlantic Institutional Architectures Through the Lenses of Two Alternative Visions" (2005), which included chapters on the creation of the transatlantic free trade area.
